We are guided by a unique set of philosophies that we shared last year in our annual report as well. Our guiding philosophies are as follows:

- 1 Thoughtful and Respectful Engagement
- 2 Underground, Behind-the-Scenes Ministry
- 3 Rooting and Establishing
- 4 Mentoring and Coaching
- 5 The Primacy of Families and the Local Church

The third philosophy "Rooting and Establishing" has this elaboration on our website:

Deep roots grow movements and strong foundations stand the test of time. We desire to see men, marriages, families, and churches rooted and established in love and truth to influence generations to come. (Colossians 2:6, 7; 1 Peter 2:1-12; Psalm 145:1-7; Timothy 5:1, 2, Ephesians 5-6).

This year has given much focus to this aspect of our work as we've been building curriculum offerings to be used to train men and women in the local church as well as developing church planter residency training for our partnership with the Harbor Network.

We are putting the finishing touches on Gospel Underground Deepen, a curriculum to help train

men and women in theology, Bible, hermeneutics, and thoughtful engagement in our time. This will be added to our GU Access program on our website where we have church planting white papers, the GU Prepare curriculum for training leaders in the church, and some bonus video content.

In partnership with our local church and the Harbor Network we have been developing and beta testing a church planter residency program to help launch, lead, and multiply healthy churches in our time. Working directly with men preparing to plant churches is indeed an honor.

We are so grateful for these opportunities to help root and establish men and women in the gospel in this increasingly polarized time.

In this annual report we hope you enjoy hearing about how we are advancing the mission of God in the borderlands between the church and culture. We are also grateful to share our financial report with you and celebrate God's faithful provision amid such inflationary times.

As our family continues to grow and evolve, we hope and pray for each of you and yours as you move forward by God's grace in his mission and good care.

THOUGHTFULLY ENGAGE PEOPLE IN CULTURE

This year our desire to help other followers of Christ to thoughtfully engage with people and culture have been central to our podcast efforts. We focused on two series which we felt were essential for believers in our moment of time. First, we looked at what it means to live respectfully in a culture that seems to be desiring to war with one another. Secondly, we focused on what it means to be wise witnesses in a warring culture by going through a framework I use in training churches to have an evangelistic culture.

AMONG We must live our lives among the peoples of the world where we overlap with those who are far from faith in Christ. SHARE We want to authentically share our life with other people, getting to know them and allowing them to get to know us. **SHARE** We share about Jesus, what he means to us, and the good news of his death, burial, and resurrection. LISTEN We want to listen well to our friends understanding what makes them tick and what ticks them off. By doing so we can share the gospel with wisdom with each person. **DISRUPT** We use questions to help people doubt their current assumptions and life foundations. Are the things that they trust most deeply, and treasure above all, really true and steady foundations for this life and the life to come? **ANSWERS** When people ask us for the reason for the hope that we have in Christ or ask questions about the teachings of the Christian faith, we must be prepared to give good answers. **REPEAT** We live this way over time, in a community where God is at work


providentially through the circumstances of life in the passing of time.


FINANCIAL REPORT



Financial Notes

- Travel costs remain high as rental cars, airfare, and hotels have been elevated.
- Every few years we have given small token of appreciation to our financial donors. This year we invested in this project that was executed by our summer intern.
- We made a mid-year decision to hire Collin Gerardi as a special projects intern from April to August this year.
 As this was apart from our annual budgeting process, we accounted for this expense from savings/reserves.
 Contractor compensation and expenses totaled \$5333.
- We continue to be funded by a combination of revenue streams with robust monthly and annual donations coupled with contract income sources driving the equation.

- Continue coaching three to four pastors or church planters.
- Roll out GU Deepen Curriculum and grow GU Access membership.

Share the Gospel with the Coming Generation

- Continue with VT Wrestling as the Team Chaplain.
 - o Teach the book of Titus in season.
 - o Develop two new leaders on the team.
- Continue partnerships with churches in New England and at Brown University.

Thoughtful Engagement

- In the fall, we will share with our podcast audience some good reasons we have supporting the truth of basic Christian doctrine. We will also answer some of the cultural objections of our day.
- Research, launch, and execute a multi-episode podcast series entitled *Imago Dei Revisited Male and Female in a Most Gendered World*.
